1. **Introduction.** This policy outlines Sherborne Prep's procedures for controlling or denying unauthorised access by pupils to potentially dangerous or risky areas of the School buildings and grounds. At any school, there are areas within the buildings or the grounds that present risks to the safety of pupils if unsupervised.

- 2. **Procedures.** The School makes every effort to ensure that all potentially dangerous areas are - wherever possible - made secure by fencing, locking or otherwise physically preventing access to them. Areas temporarily out of bounds are fenced or cordoned off and appropriate warning notices placed to describe the danger. Some of the School grounds away from the main buildings, such as Lower Paddock, are unlit and hence unauthorised access to these areas is prohibited during the hours of darkness. Pupils are reminded regularly by Boarding House and teaching staff of the dangers. They are made aware that to enter such an area deliberately is regarded as a disciplinary offence that will be dealt with in an appropriate manner.
- Unsupervised access by Pupils. We ensure that pupils do not have unsupervised access to potentially dangerous areas, such as the science laboratories, the Design Technology classroom, Netherton's cellar and the Sport's Hall storage area. Doors to these areas are kept locked at all times when not in use. All flammables and laboratory chemicals are kept securely locked in appropriate storage facilities. Pupils are not allowed to use sporting equipment without supervision. Pupils do not have access to the Grounds, Maintenance or Catering areas of the School.
- 4. **Areas of higher risk.** There are areas of the School site which are out of bounds without staff supervision:

- 5. **Boarding Specific Information.** During the School day boarders are out of the boarding house and integrated into school life. Unless they are ill or for reasons known to boarding staff, they are to be out of the house during school hours. All boarding pupils must attend a register in the Boarding House and are then expected to be in their boarding house or designated area for prep. After prep, boarding pupils have free time in the house and with permission are allowed to play sport outside. Access is given to Music Rooms for evening practice and lessons. Spot checks are carried out by duty staff on practices and lessons take place with the Peripatetic staff. All boarders return to the boarding house by a designated time given by house duty staff.
- 6. **Security.** The duty boarding staff member patrols the School site in the evening and makes sure it is secure. At least twice each day, a visual patrol is carried out by the Group Custos staff of the school grounds. All doors that provide access to the main school buildings and/or classrooms areas are locked.
